

This is the paper writing referred to in the numbered Executor's Oath of Anne Maria Cooper taken before me this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of June 1903.

This is the Last Will and Testament OF ME  
Joseph Cooper of Colac in the  
Colony of Victoria Carpenter and Butcher

AFTER payment of all my just debts funeral and testamentary expenses

I GIVE DEVISE AND BEQUEATH unto to my son "Tom"  
the sum of Fifty pounds to be paid to him  
as soon as he shall attain the age of  
Twenty one years or sooner if in the opinion  
of my Executrix the same would be of benefit

to him in his advancement in life And I give  
I give devise and bequeath to my dear wife Maria  
Cooper (if she shall survive me) All the rest residue  
and remainder of my real and personal property  
whichever and wheresoever situate for her sole  
and separate use and benefit

AND I HEREBY APPOINT my said wife Maria  
Cooper sole

EXECUTRIX of this my Will IN WITNESS whereof I have hereunto  
set my hand this fifteenth day of January in the year  
of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy seven

Signed by the said Joseph Cooper  
the Testator and by him declared to be his last  
Will and Testament in the presence of us  
present at the same time who in his presence at  
his request and in the presence of each other  
have hereunto subscribed our names as  
Witnesses
